
## LIONS IN HUMAN CULTURE

This exhibit focuses on the fascination that this animal has had over different aspects of human culture and artistic expression, from painting, sculpture, mythology, and ancient legends, to religious scenes from the Old and New Testament, fiction, visual arts, cinema, heraldry, astrology and so on.

From a historic point of view, this collection gathers creations starting with the Paleolithic and Neolithic periods, passing through Antiquity, the Middle Ages, Renaissance, reaching today's period, where it covers contemporary aspects such as sports mascots, company logos and commercials.
